- 2. Interpretation "What does it mean?" & "What did it mean?"

 Try to determine what the book, passage, or sentence meant to the original readers.

 Look up the context it in which it took place. What is God communicating here?
- 3. Application "What does it mean to me (us)?"

Is it to **teach** me some new understanding? **Expose** something in my actions? **Correct** some wrong understanding or prejudice I have about God, other people, or myself? **Train** me to live a more holy, righteous life? If <u>I</u> were to truly apply this passage to my life how would it change the way <u>I</u> think or act?
